## REMEMBER WHEN...... Part III of III.

### **OUR FIRST YEAR 1975-1976**

By March 3<sup>rd</sup>, panic had set in with regard to the completion of the Madame's Maple Leaf quilt, as the Museum has requested its completion for the Museum's Annual Antique Sale which will be held on April 15<sup>th</sup>. The quilting was less than half completed. Members are now being asked to design original pictorial or symbolic blocks representing the history of Sudbury for the Historical Presentation Quilt. Numerous activities were planned including: an invitation to Mrs Valerie Jervais-Reid, a professional embroideress from England to conduct a 3 day workshop; a bus trip to the New Hamburg Mennonite Relief Sale and to attend the Canadian Quilters workshop; and an invitation to Mr. Aurele Labrosse, owner of The Needle Shop on Elgin Street, to give a series of workshops in canvas work to the Guild.

On March 11<sup>th</sup>, Nyla Gorham, Art Consultant for the Ministry of Education presented a "very worthwhile" workshop in the Guild meeting room on Creativity in Needlework. Members were asked to bring a list of items along with their Imaginations, enthusiasm and an open mind. Marg Conibear and Shouette Haywood managed to complete their projects that night.

By **April 8**<sup>th</sup>, it was reported that the Madame's Maple Leaf Quilt "is almost ready to be taken out of the frame. Mary Conroy will check it over, trim and pin the binding to it, Karen Annis and Helen Ayers made the picot edging and someone as yet unknown will actually sew the binding in place." Mary Conroy thanked the more than 100 members who worked more than 2000 hours on the quilt and stated "surprisingly, it looks just fine." The stitchery group appears to be quite active having completed 3 samplers, while the quilting group now has Hick's Flower Basket quilt on the frame.

The final Annual Meeting, on May 18<sup>th</sup>, was held as a potluck at Mary Conroy's home. Reports for the year mentioned that

- The Guild had 66 members for the first year
- Guild members learned a great deal with the making of Madame's Maple Leaf Quilt "especially the difficulties in putting it together"
- 9 stitchery workshops were held with approximately 20 attendees

### MOSAIC

Resource: Youtube - Donna Jordan OCTOBER BLOCK OF THE MONTH

Due: November 4, 2025

### MATERIALS:

4-10" square (4 different batik fabrics)

8 – 1" x 15 1/2" (black background provided)

### **INSTRUCTIONS:**

1. Stack the blocks 2 by 2 with right sides up.


2. Make a diagonal cut through your 1st stack of 10" blocks. You choose the angle of the cut. Do the same to the second stack. Mark a 1/4" in the middle of the blocks along the cut diagonal and place another mark in the middle of 1" black strip along the sides. Used to align block.

3. Switch 1 block from the bottom with 1 from the top.

4. Using the marks to align the pieces, stitch the blocks Together. Press the seam towards the batik.

5. Choose 2 different blocks from the 4 blocks and stack 2 blocks right side up. Cut the block diagonally in whatever angle you wish again. Mark the blocks the same way you did the first time so that the blocks line up. Stitch them together. Press towards the black background.

Do your remaining 2 blocks.




#### **End Result:**


You should have 4 blocks with 4 different batik fabrics in each block. You can snip the black 1" strips so they are not hanging over the block. DO NOT SQUARE THESE BLOCKS (the person who wins these blocks will square them).

2 of your blocks will go to the Block Lottery.

2 of your blocks will go towards making a Community Quilt. Who would like to put it together? el love the quilt with sashing. Who would like to quilt it? What do you prefer?

Kits will be available, but if you prefer to use your own fabric stash, the fabric requirements are listed below:

### 9" Block / 20 Blocks

**Fabric A**: WOF 4 strips @ 6.5" = cut 20 - 6.5" squares

**Fabric C**: WOF 4 strips @ 3.5" = cut 20 - 3.5" squares


<u>Fabric D & L:</u> WOF 4 strips of each colors @ 4" = cut 20 - 4" x 7"



# MACRAME SNOWFLAKE ORNAMENT

Tuesday, November 18, 2025

Macramé is an old textile craft that uses simple knotting techniques. It is also an easy craft to pick up. There are 5 basic knots. It is the combinations of these basic knots that can create elaborate & ornamental knotting forms, and this makes the macramé appear more intricate & lacier.

The macramé snowflake pattern is very simple, and the snowflake is easy to make. The snowflakes (shown below) require only 3 basic knots. If you can tie a knot, you can macramé.

Yarn/cording, a central plastic ring & a macramé board will be provided to make one macramé snowflake. Please join me in creating a simple, yet quick snowflake ornament.

## **CHOCOLATE ZUCCHINI CAKE**

### Tracy Gunn

It is a moist cake and a good keeper. It freezes very well. Makes 1 – 9x13 pan or 2 - loaves

<u>Ingredients</u>	<u>Amount</u>
Butter or Margarine, softened	½ cup
Granulated Sugar	1 ¾ cups
Eggs	2
Cooking Oil	½ cup
Sour Milk (or 1 tbsp. vinegar added to milk)	½ cup
Vanilla	1 tsp.
Grated zucchini with peel	2 cups

All-purpose flour	2 ½ cups
Cocoa	1/3 cup
Baking soda	1 tsp.
Baking power	½ tsp.
Cinnamon	½ tsp.
Salt	½ tsp.

Chocolate Chips (semi sweet or milk	¾ cup
chocolate)	/4 Cup

Preheat oven to 350 °F. In large mixing bowl cream together butter and sugar, add in eggs 1 at a time. Mix in cooking oil, sour milk, vanilla and zucchini.

Mix next 6 (dry) ingredients together in a small bowl. Add to batter, stirring well until moistened and well blended.

Spread in a greased 9 x 13 inch pan. Alternatively you can divide evenly in two 8" greased loaf pans.

Sprinkle with the chocolate chips. For 9 x 13 inch pan, bake in oven for about 35 minutes. For loaf pans, bake for 45-50 minutes, until wooden pick comes out clean.
