



Just imagine; Dianne managed to get her challenge done. No pressure, just humor.



All the kits were gone by the end of the day, so we should see some on the clothes line soon.




- This year's Anniversary Token is stitched on 32ct Antique White linen. Stitch count: 88 x 33. Heart & Home stamp is stitched on 18ct white perforated paper. Stitch count: 23 x 11.
- Back stitch bird legs, large cross stitches & arrows in heart with 1 strand 3787.
- Additional finishing bits: small piece 18ct white perforated paper, coordinating woolfelt, baker's twine, cotton fabric & stuffing.
- I will publish a picture walk blogpost on my website to share with you some of the finishing details.

I think we'll be able to use some quilt ladders and quilt racks if you have any that we could use for the event. Any suggestions will be welcomed.

I am getting sneak peaks of some of the amazing quilts and I can't wait to see them all in person.

12½" Unfinished

HEART BLOCK FEBRUARY BLOCK OF THE MONTH

Resource: Dianne Soucy

Due: March 3, 2026

Do you remember the Block of the Month for November? We are doing Flying Geese again. I also stitch with a scant ¼". I will be at Community Quilt (February 7th)


Materials:

a (white on white) background

1- 7 ¼" x 7 ¼"

4- 3 ½" x 3 ½"

2- 6 ½" x 3 ½" (center)




b (reds)

(1)- 7 ¾" x 7 ¾" (star points)


(2)- 3 ½" x 3 ½" (bottom snowball)

(4)- 1 ½" x 1 ½" (top snowball)



4 Flying Geese At A Time:

1. Draw a line diagonally on the wrong side of the red (7 ¾" x 7 ¾").



2. Cut this piece of fabric by dissecting the diagonal lines through the center of the material.

3. Lay 2 (b) blocks diagonally on (a) 7 ¼" x 7 ¼" (background)


I stitched a scant ¼" from both sides of the drawn diagonal line.

4. Cut on the drawn diagonal line and press to the dark side.

5. Take the 2 pressed pieces and add the 2 remaining squares with the lines as shown.

6. Stitch a scant 1/4" on both sides of the line and then cut along the drawn line.

7. Press and square to 3 ½" x 6 ½" (4 Flying Geese)



SNOWBALL ON CENTER

Draw a line diagonally on the back of 2 (b) 3 ½" x 3 ½" and 4 (b) 1 ½" x 1 ½"

Snowball as shown on the 2 (a) 6 ½" x 3 ½". Stitch to the right of the diagonal line, cut ¼" from the sewn line towards the corner and press one to the dark side and one to the light side. You want the seams to nestle when stitching the heart. Do the same thing on the 1½" pieces.

Stitch together as shown watching your points.

Community Quilt Block: In honor of my daughter, I picked purple (amethyst) because it is February's birth stone. Please use purples and a different background fabric. Thank you for participating.


Stepping Stone Quilt

60" by 80"

This is a quick and easy ONE BLOCK quilt top. All you need are 36 Jelly Roll Strips to make this 60" by 80" inch Couch quilt. Since this is a single block which measures 10" finished, it's easy to change the size of this quilt to suit your needs. Watch the YouTube video for tips on how to create this fun one block wonder. 

Supply List (48 Blocks)

- A) 40 Jelly Roll Strips (you will have a few left over)
- B) 2.5 yards of background or 36 low volume strips which are 2.5" by WOF
- C) Backing Fabric 5.5 yards.
- D) Binding 3/4 yard





Stepping Stone Quilt

Layout for 60" by 80" quilt



Quilt Blocks will measure 10.5" before they are sewn into the quilt top. They are 10" when the quilt top is finished. lay 6 blocks in each row. Make 8 rows to complete the top.



March 10 & 24 we have Joan Chabot teaching the Reverse Applique Bag, so make sure you don't miss out if you wanted to take that class.

On **February 10 the Quilting 101** participants are going to learn how to put their final piece together, which will leave us with **Paper Piecing on April 14**. The Paper piecing class will be the final one for the Quilting 101 participants, but we are also opening it up to other guild members if they'd like to learn this fun technique. Anyone wanting to learn, must sign up, so that the room can be set up with enough tables for people to bring their sewing machines and get the most out of the class.

Wool Applique is being held on **Saturday April 11** and has a full house already. There is a registration and kit fee of \$25.00 for the workshop and you must make your colour choices in advance. You can see either Marjorie or Tracy to pay the fee and also pick your colour. A full refund will be given up to 2 weeks before the workshop (by March 28) and if you must cancel your spot, an email will be sufficient.

We can only accommodate 36 participants.






De-Stash

Together, these effects show that simple, creative pastimes can be deeply therapeutic, emotionally grounding, and beneficial for long-term health.


